

Anatomy of a Web Address

URL is the abbreviation for Uniform Resource Locator, which lists the exact location (address) of any Internet resource: a WWW page, an ftp file, a newsgroup, or a Gopher site.

Each word and symbol of the URL represents something specific, allowing the routing computer to direct information to the correct location.

Format of the URL: protocol://host/path/filename

Example: <http://www.inform.umd.edu/EdRes/Colleges/>

1. Protocol: http
2. Host computer name: www
3. Second-level domain name: inform
4. Top-level domain name: umd.edu
5. Directory name: EdRes
6. File name: Colleges/

Additional Server Affiliations or Top-level Domains (TLD's)

- **com** - business & commercial
- **gov** - government institutions
- **net** - network resources
- **edu** - educational institutions
- **mil** - military institutions
- **org** - usually non-profit

Several Two-letter Internet country Codes

- **ch** - Switzerland
- **de** - Germany
- **jp** - Japan
- **uk** - United Kingdom
