## **Anatomy of a Web Address**

URL is the abbreviation for Uniform Resource Locator, which lists the exact location (address) of any Internet resource: a WWW page, an ftp file, a newsgroup, or a Gopher site.

Each word and symbol of the URL represents something specific, allowing the routing computer to direct information to the correct location.

Format of the URL: protocol://host/path/filename

Example: <a href="http://www.inform.umd.edu/EdRes/Colleges/">http://www.inform.umd.edu/EdRes/Colleges/</a>

1. Protocol: http

2. Host computer name: www

3. Second-level domain name: inform

4. Top-level domain name: umd.edu

5. Directory name: EdRes

6. File name: Colleges/
